**FACT SHEET ON ATLANTA STATE FARMERS MARKET
OPENED JANUARY 1959**

WORLD'S LARGEST ROADSIDE FRUIT AND VEGETABLE STAND.

150 acres completely fenced, largest in the Southeast and one of the largest Markets in the World.

OPEN SEVEN DAYS A WEEK: 24 hours a day, 364 days a year, closed to the public Christmas Day.

TRANSPORTATION: Truck and rail lines, near Interstate and Atlanta's Hartsfield International Airport. Over 100 tractor trailer loads per day paying a gate fee. Lease tenants who own vehicles are not included.

VISITORS: Over 3,500 people daily.

MARKET ACCOMMODATION: Restaurant, Scales and Motels nearby. Welcome Center.

PARTICIPANTS: All over the United States, chain grocery stores, brokers, receivers, packers, repackers, farmers and retailers.

ECONOMICS: Initial cost of Market (\$10 million), Budget (\$3.59 million in 2009, sales \$489.6 million), Employs over 3,700, estimated payroll \$75 million.

PRODUCE - RETAIL SHED AREA: 18 open Sheds. (576 Stalls) six enclosed Sheds (96 Stalls). One building for Hamper House and packing facilities. Major distribution center for Christmas trees (an average of 250,000 a year).

NURSERY PLANT AREA: 7 sheds (over 80,000 sq. ft.) featuring bedding plants, flowers, shrubs, trees and other greenery.

SERVICES: 24 hour Market operation - Restaurant, Hamper House, Weights and Measures Laboratory, and Exhibition Hall - 25,920 sq. ft. seating capacity / 600, rent \$1000.00 per day. Number of shows Fiscal 2009 (22). Shows attract over 58,000 visitors.

MARKET ACTIVITIES AND PROMOTIONS: Tours (School, Church and Home Economic Groups). Radio and Television promotions.

MARKET OPERATIONS: Licensing, Rent Collectors, Inspectors, Police, Maintenance, Engineer, Area Marketing Coordinators, Security Check Point.

A HISTORY OF THE ATLANTA STATE FARMERS MARKET

In 1935 the Legislature authorized the Commissioner of Agriculture to establish a Farmers' Market in the city of Atlanta.

A permanent State regulated Market was opened in 1939 on a 16 acre tract on Murphy Avenue in West End.

This first Farmers Market cost \$150,000 to build. Produce from over 42 States and 8 Countries arrived each month with over 200 individual items sold there.

Because of the amount of produce needed to feed service-men during World War II and the boom years following the War, the Market began to outgrow its location. The search began for a larger geographical location to house the Market. Construction began in 1958 and the market opened in its' present location in January of 1959.

SPACE ASSIGNMENTS

Effective Jan. 1, 2008

ASSIGNMENT OF SPACE AND COLLECTION OF FEES as provided by the Rules and Regulations of the Atlanta State Farmers' Market, Chapter 40-9-7-.02, Authority Ga. Law 1981, p. 1354, as amended.

1. a. Gate Fees - The following gate fees cover all vehicles entering the Market to deliver, sell or offer for sale and resalable products, except trucks owned and operated by bonded dealers holding a lease on the Market or those owned and operated by Georgia Farmers.

(1)	Class	1	2-axles	\$3.00
(2)	Class	2	3-4 axles	\$6.00
(3)	Class	3	5-axles	\$10.00

- b. All Georgia Farmers shall be exempt from paying a gate fee. A gate fee ticket must be completed on all Georgia Farmers entering the Market and marked N/C - no charge.

2. Assignment of Space - All vehicles bringing products to deliver, sell or offer for sale their contents will stop at the entrance gate and pay fee, except those owned or operated by Georgia Farmers. If products are to be offered for sale in the shed area, driver will be directed to the Inspection and Assignment Station. Upon approval of the load by the inspector, driver will be assigned space in the appropriate area of the Market as follows:

- a. Open Shed: The gate ticket shall be good for 24 hours parking on one stall or until load is sold, whichever comes first. If not sold at the end of this 24 hour period, space will be assigned on Space Rent Basis for an additional 24 hours at \$6.00 per space.

Note: Georgia Farmers will be charged on the Space Rent Basis after the first 24 hours for use of the same stall. The 24 hour period will be determined by the first load assigned to a stall.

- b. Enclosed Sheds: Pull Down Doors
\$12.00 per day.
Monthly Rate-----5% lower than daily rate per month.
- c. Maximum number of stalls per license is four.
- d. Maximum number of stalls or bays per license in enclosed sheds is four.
(Except for persons holding more spaces as of January 1, 1975.

3. Electricity - Any use of electricity, other than lights, must be approved by the Market Manager or his representative. An additional fee will be assessed, payable in advance, for additional electrical usage.
