


Yellow-legged Hornet Update: Three Nests Eradicated

Since the last issue of the *Yellow-legged Ledger*, the Plant Protection Division (PPD) has located and eradicated three Yellow-legged Hornet (YLH) nests in the Savannah area. One nest was removed by a vigilant homeowner, another by a pest management professional, and the third was discovered abandoned.

As we are still early in the secondary nest season, it's too soon to determine whether these were primary or secondary nests. Further analysis is currently underway.



Update by the Numbers:

New Traps Deployed (since January 1, 2025): 799 Total traps deployed (August 17, 2023 – July 23, 2025): 2,046 Hornets found (June 26, 2025 – July 9, 2025): 23 Nests found & eradicated (July 10, 2025 – July 23, 2025): 3 Total nests found & eradicated (August 2023 – July 23, 2025): 63

Issue 32: July 10, 2025 – July 24, 2025

- 2025: 4 embryo nests, 4 primary nests, 2 secondary nests
- 2024: 4 embryo nests, 3 primary nests, 40 secondary nests
 - Total: 47
- 2023: 5 secondary nests

The latest YLH activity map offers an overview of recent detection trends. Areas with positive trap captures are shown as a heatmap, while confirmed nest locations are marked with red squares.
