Updates on Yellow-Legged Hornet Eradication Efforts

Between 5/16/24 and 6/6/24 GDA staff deployed an additional 257 YLH traps bringing the total number of traps to 640, trapped 19 worker hornets, and eradicated one embryo nest. The Department's Plant Protection Division (PPD) is hiring part-time positions to assist with our eradication efforts.

Embryo Nest Removed

On Tuesday, June 4, 2024, David Williams and Chris Adams of GDA's PPD eradicated an embryo nest from a Savannah area building with the assistance of Mark Willman of Yates-Astro Pest Control. Department staff were alerted of the nest by local residents, and we continue to ask for the publics' vigilance.

How to Report Sightings and Nests

If you come across a yellow-legged hornet nest, please take a photo and report it using the online <u>YLH reporting form</u> or by emailing <u>yellow.legged.hornet@agr.georgia.gov</u>. It's crucial to ensure that the queen is eliminated if you remove a nest to prevent her from establishing another nest elsewhere. If you're unsure about removing a nest, please contact the GDA for assistance.


